

WHAT TO BRING

- Sleeping bag or blankets, and pillow

- A bathing suit
- Towels, face cloth, soap, toiletries
- Comfortable shoes and socks for walking, runners for beach wear - going barefoot is not allowed
- Sunhat, sunscreen
- Medications
- Musical instruments, books, games, etc.

Counsellors are mature, capable and enthusiastic university students trained to provide effective leadership and care. A first aid attendant is in residence. Our catering staff provide three healthy, nutritionally balanced meals daily as well as tasty snacks.

Camp Alexandra is rich with history and has been hosting campers on 2 1/2 acres by the seaside for more than 95 years. A long sandy shelf runs out into Boundary Bay from the shore, ideal for crabbing and exploring. The camp is convenient to White Rock & municipal parks.

1) **Nursery** - a trained ECD supervisor provides care in a well-equipped self contained facility.

2) **Children** - a Counsellor is responsible for children 5 yrs & up during activity periods and some mealtimes & introduces children to the joys & benefits of camping. Activities include hiking, arts & crafts, campfire songs & skits, beach combing & specialized programs.

SUPPORTED ADULT CAMPS



Camp Alexandra provides enjoyable summer activities and events for adults wishing socialization, recreation and an exciting change in the routines of daily living. Our goal is to provide a high level of personal care with attention to safety.

ACCOMMODATION

Our student counsellors are responsible for the care, safety and orientation of their campers, who are assigned to counselor groups with a 7-1 ratio. Campers are housed in groups and sleep in cabins and rooms **without** their counsellors. Please contact us if you are uncertain your camper will be comfortable with the ratio.

PROGRAM

A wide variety of activities and programs are provided during camp including talent night, bingo, dances, picnics, beach fun, out-trips, cooking, arts and crafts and campfire, with special events every evening.
